Patient Safety Education


Despite the existence of considerable information about how to improve on care, there remains insufficient education in patient safety for a broad base of healthcare personnel. Where education is available, there are challenges with how to actually use the knowledge and implement the necessary changes in a complex delivery system.

Why a Patient Safety Education Program for Health Care?

- Little to no exposure to basics of safety or high reliability science
- Identified gap in staff training in patient safety
- A focus on training individuals /on-line learning in efforts to be more efficient
 - when healthcare is delivered by teams
- Adult education principles not practiced
